We also went to see the endangered Baker's Manzanita at the corner of Facendini and Occidental Road and the big patch of it off Stoetz Lane, where we also observed the dried stalks of last years endangered Pennel's Birdsbeak.

We are so blessed to have these really rare and beautiful plants and their serpentine community in our watershed.
